Congratulations to Mr Keshe, who was present for every single Thursday workshop, no matter what the conditions...or what national holiday!

There are also team members who are present in the background to support the broadcast of the workshops, including myself (Rick) as host, Vince (who has always been there since the very beginnings), Stanley (setup and organizing), and Flint (who hosts the KF online private teachings too). And not to forget Fabio, who was our sound technician before he passed in a tragic accident in July of 2016.

What is it like to be part of the support team for Mr Keshe during the live online workshops?

In one word, "Busy!" In two words, "Busy" and "Fun"!

During the workshop, we in the support crew are doing things in the background such as checking the audio and video feeds, adjusting sound levels, getting visual media ready, monitoring chats, muting and unmuting microphones, and a host of other jobs. It takes our full attention to keep the flow of the workshop going.

The broadcast crew brings Mr Keshe's voice and images to the world through a variety of devices. We begin the broadcast by starting up the various social media streams, and then we attend to the needs of Mr Keshe as the workshop progresses. It can be stressful because of the live, real-time nature of the show. We seldom know what to expect, and we never have a script! And sometimes glitches happen, for example a broadcasting device may fail to work properly, or sound cut out due to limited internet bandwidth. We are learning to move through issues quickly to avoid confusion and the dreaded "dead air time" silence.

Besides the tech issues, it is a fine balancing act to provide a live show with many people in the audience, and also provide space where Mr. Keshe can speak freely without interruptions. We try to prepare chat questions for Mr Keshe, but it's a live show and spontaneous questions often occur in the question period. Occasionally we get into an awkward situation with tough or surprising questions from people, but Mr Keshe always seems to handle the situations diplomatically. One of the greatest things about working with Mr Keshe is experiencing his tolerance of people from all parts of the planet, and his willingness to communicate with people from all walks of life and education levels.

I am most grateful for the last four years as online workshop host and being part of the support team. The team has received thanks for its work from people located in virtually all of the countries of the world.

I think it's got to be one of the best jobs on the planet!

Origins of the Knowledge Seekers Workshops

The weekly Keshe Knowledge Seekers Workshops are at the core of the plasma knowledge that is published by the Keshe Foundation.

But do you know where the concept for this amazing live online Workshop series came from?

However, it is not well known that a series of monthly workshops called the "Public Teaching Workshops" were recorded in the year before the Knowledge Seekers Workshops.

These 10 public teachings became the basis for the Knowledge Seekers Workshops.

The original "1st Public Teaching Workshop" was on March 5th, 2013, but it took me a full month to edit and was uploaded in 8 parts of 15-minutes each because of YouTube limits!

Now that you know where the Knowledge Seekers Workshop series originated, perhaps you would like to know where the Public Teaching Workshops idea came from?

The origins of the Public Teaching Workshops came from the Keshe Plasma Reactor Group meetings which began in the spring of 2012. A few friends and I on the west coast of Canada got together for dinner meetings where we discussed alternate energy and did experiments with a Keshe perspective. Guy became a regular "lab member" in person. We began to share ideas with a few others on group Skype calls. Vince was there on the beginning calls.

As others got interested we began to communicate using pictures and video, and to record the sessions. Mr Keshe would sometimes join in to answer our questions and teach us the plasma way.

Mr Keshe thought that the Plasma Reactor Group was a good way to advance the knowledge of the Plasma technology, and so in March 2013, he proposed that we broadcast a live monthly public teaching workshop and record it. So, we launched the Public Teaching Workshops which were held monthly over the following year of 2013.

And the rest is history, as they say!

Keshe Foundation Official Workshops



Recently, the Keshe Foundation began recruiting Workshop Teachers to teach Official Foundation workshops. Each applicant is interviewed, after-which he/she is issued a teaching certificate by the Foundation. The teaching certificate states the name of the teacher as well as the qualification level of the teacher. We qualify applicants based on their knowledge and understanding and practical experience with plasma technology. Qualification levels range from level 1 to level 5, level 5 being expert knowledge. This is part of the Foundation's effort to ensure the public is taught 100% correct standardized, official methodology when attending official plasma workshops.

For several years now, the Foundation has encouraged the public to experiment and share their knowledge of plasma technology. We thank those who have engaged in this crucial work. Official workshop teachers are given specific instructions on how the Foundation expects them to conduct their workshops. They are instructed to only teach the Foundation's official methods. While we respect and admire innovation, official workshop attendees are only taught methods that the Foundation has tested with success.

We do not allow our teachers to teach innovations unless the innovation has been approved by the Foundation.

The Foundation has taken steps to ensure our products are Certified by an authority. Our health products for example carry the CE certification mark of approval. In order to gain Certification, a product has to be submitted to an authority and thoroughly tested. It is a long and costly process, but Certification gives the public confidence that the product has met the standards and regulations of the governments of countries where it will be sold. Our workshop teachers teach the steps involved in how to create our Certified products and they teach the basic concepts of magnetic and gravitational fields, plasma, nano particles, GANS as well as the importance of intention.

It is my aim in writing this to ensure you that if you attend an official workshop you will be taught officially sanctioned Keshe Foundation methodology by qualified teachers. The teacher might show the workshop group an innovation to standard Foundation product design, but the innovation will not be taught. It will only be shown to show the innovative potential of plasma technology.

There are important distinctions between attending an “official” Foundation workshop and an “unofficial” workshop. We cannot make the decision for you as to whether you should attend an official or unofficial workshop, but we can make you aware of these distinctions.

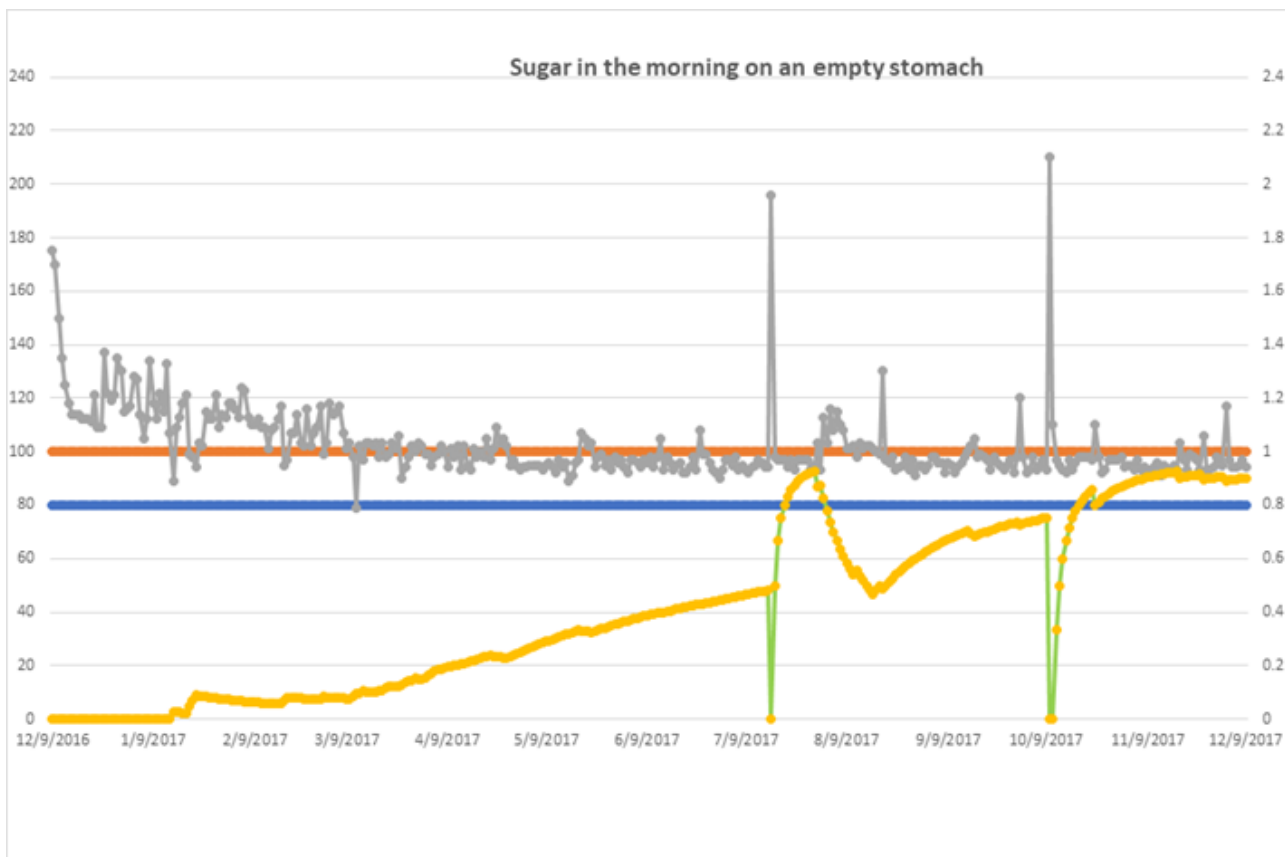

Diabetes Research Testimonial

Here is an article about using of MAGRAV energy in medicine. The below diagram description is a documented case of working with diabetes. The work began a year ago (the gray curve is the sugar in the morning on an empty stomach) and, as you can see, we are still work on this case to achieve full recovery. The lower green curve with yellow dots is the calculated value of the recovery rate, which is a moving zero-to-one moving average of the number of days with normal sugar. This indicator recently entered the permissible corridor in the range from 0.9 to 1.0, stabilized around 0.91 and so far, it does not move further.



The most interesting are the relapses of the disease, which return for a very short time, and cause the recovery rate to reset, and then quickly raise the coefficient of health to a higher level.

Such bright outbursts during the year only occurred twice in July and in October, but they show that currently in the body there is a structural reorganization that forces a seemingly incurable disease to recede. I called this restructuring a “recovery reaction.”

The treatment was done by drinking water, influenced first by two dozen Pain Pens (for at least 24 hours). In July, the treatment was changed to consuming liquid plasma therapy CO₂ and ZnO.

An interesting observation was that the sugar at the beginning of the treatment quickly approached the norm, it seemed to me that the treatment would not take long. However, one year was not enough to cure the disease, but significant progress was achieved. I have not lost hope that in the New Year everything will fall into place with wise advice, which I hope to get from readers of your newsletter.
